Targets:

## 5. Partnerships, principles of cooperation, and funding

### **Criteria for cooperation with research partners of the Scientific Group:**

- 1) protecting **independence** of the Scientific Group, and we want to be **inclusive** with research partnerships (e.g. Asia, Africa, LAC... not only Europe and North American)
  - 2) Scientific Group (coordinated by Chair & Vice Chairs) define desirable **themes for background research and papers**, considering transparency, excellence and diversity when agreeing on background research with partners,
  - 3) papers **by the** Scientific Group have Group members as authors, and / or may have co-authors from partnering research organizations.
  - 4) papers **for the** Group (commissioned papers) in support of the Scientific Group's agenda are decided by Scientific Group (through Chair & Vice Chairs), and are peer reviewed through Scientific Group mechanism.
- >> e.g. CGIAR, USAID (IFPRI), BMZ (ZEF), IIASA, Academies... and more...
